St. Elizabeth Committee November 20, 2022

The St. Elizabeth Committee is inactive except for the following: prayers and cards. Both these teams welcome new people!

Cards: This group takes turns, month by month, sending out cards to those who are ill, shut-in, or celebrating. Would you like to participate? Contact me. If the cost of cards or stamps would be a burden, St. Elizabeth has funds for reimbursement.

Prayers: There are 3 prayer systems at St. Nicholas:

Prayers in the altar: I believe these are limited to Orthodox people. Put a slip in the basket on table at entry to church. (These are not part of St. Elizabeth.)

Prayer team: This is a group of people who commit to praying daily for people. Names and concerns are put in the box in the entry and sent out to the prayer team. No restriction to Orthodox or parishioners. Privacy is maintained. Names stay on the list for about a month. Please contact me if you feel called to be a pray-er.

Prayer sheets: I make these every month, including members of the parish. I used to print them out, before Covid, but now Fr. John sends them out via email. I travel enough that I'm not always here at the beginning of the month. If someone would like to take responsibility for printing them monthly, let me know.

Bread Bakers: We are in need of new bakers. We now have two liturgies every week, and a number of bakers are no longer available. If you know how to bake bread, but feel leary of trying to bake Prosphora—the loaves with special seals which are used for communion—I invite you to consider baking Antidoron. This is the bread we get after Communion. The recipe is simple, and no specific shape is required (so it could be made in a bread machine). Please talk to Kathryn Falkenstern, Diane Cook, or me.
